Volunteers needed for river monitoring



The Zoological Society of London is offering training in the **River Monitoring Initiative (RMI)** sampling method. The RMI is a national scheme for monitoring the health of rivers developed by the Riverfly Partnership.

In order to be trained in the RMI you must be able to sample the river for at least 6 months. Once at the river, samples take about 30 minutes and are taken once per month.

In the Training you will learn;

- The background of the RMI.
- How to kick sample a river.
- How to identify river invertebrates.
- What to do with the RMI data.
- How the RMI fits into the wider Citizen Crane Project.

You will also meet other volunteers working up and down the Crane River. Everyone involved in the scheme will have a day out at London Zoo.

The training will take place at the Shot Tower, Crane Park Island, Twickenham
